The Department of Psychology is seeking inspirational and energetic candidate as Teaching Assistant to support its growing scope of learning and teaching initiatives and endeavours. This is an exciting opportunity for those who wish to be part of a committed and enthusiastic team eager to develop his/her career in higher education institutions.

Successful applicant will join the teams of highly qualified educators to deliver a wide variety of learning and teaching activities. Responsibilities mainly include (i) conducting various teaching activities (e.g. tutorials/laboratory sessions, in-class case discussions, providing support to fieldwork/trips, practicum, workshops, on-site technical support to lectures where necessary, etc.); (ii) assisting in the preparation of course materials and administration; (iii) to provide supervisory and pastoral support to students; (iv) to invigilate examination and mark assignments, and other duties assigned by the Department (e.g., support to visits to the Greater Bay Area (GBA) and/or other parts of mainland China).

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably a Master's degree, in Psychology or in a relevant discipline with some experience in providing teaching support. They should have an excellent command of both written English and Chinese; proficiency in spoken English and Putonghua is preferred. They should also be self-motivated, well-organized, have good interpersonal and communication skills, be able to work independently and collectively as a good team member and have the ability to work under pressure. Those with experience in providing teaching support in tertiary institutions will have advantages.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits,
