For the priority arrangement in credit transfer in General Education, “*1st*” denotes the GE course for the first 3-credit-point transfer and “*2nd*” denotes the GE course for the second 3-credit-point transfer.

Note:

- The Associate Degree / Higher Diploma graduates are exempted 3 - 6 credit points by the University in General Education upon their admission to the Five-year Full-time Bachelor of Education (Honours) (Primary / Physical Education / Secondary / Business, Accounting and Financial Studies / Geography / Science).
- All students must take the General Education (GE) Foundation Course (4 credit points), GE Interdisciplinary Course (3 credit points), University ePortfolio Course (3 credit points), Experiential Learning Course (3 credit points), and Co-curricular and Service Learning Course (3 credit points). Normally no credit transfer is granted in these courses.
- Credit transfer will be granted in one or two GE Breadth courses (GEBC) among GE Breadth Learning Strands (1-3) (GELS) and Positive and Values Education (PAVE) Course. The priority of the GEBCs for credit transfer are shown in the table above.

4. Students who are granted 3 credit points transfer only in GEBCs have to take the remaining PAVE Course, and the GE Interdisciplinary Course. For example, a BEd student with 3 credit points transfer from GELS should take PAVE Course, in addition to completing the GE Interdisciplinary Course. On the other hand, students who are granted 6 credit points transfer in both GELS and PAVE Course only need to take the GE Interdisciplinary Course for completing all requirement in GEBCs.
