


Learning Sociological Concepts through Role Play


To function as "assessment as learning" and "assessment for learning", students are able to learn through activities that aims at testing their understanding and developing creative and logical thinking, this moves them on to other concepts they need to learn. The topics stakeholder interest, organizational interest, socio political and leadership theories are difficult to understand, the activities designed in the lesson is authentic and contextualized which enable learners to reflect from their inner resources and own experience, and generate the theories at the end. Students are able to learn more effectively by the activities in this topic. Below are the descriptions of the activities:

Below shows the activity outputs by students who took different roles in prioritizing the aims of education






- After students completed the exercises, they presented their finding; teacher compared the lists among different groups and introduced the concept of "stakeholder" and stakeholder's interest
- Teacher then conclude the theories of bureaucratic administration
 After assigned a reading lesson to strengthen their understanding on organization,
 governance and structure, students are asked to do a picture study exercise to
 consolidate their understanding of organization and further explore the socio political
 theories and leadership theories
