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Professor Chris Chapman is Chair of Educational Policy at the University of Glasgow and Director of Policy Scotland. He is also the PI/ Director of Children's Neighbourhoods Scotland & Network for Social and Educational Equity and Founding Director of the Robert Owen Centre for Educational Change. He serves as a member of the First Minister's International Council of Education Advisors and was seconded as Senior Academic Advisor to Scottish Government 2015-21. Prior to his move to Glasgow in January 2013 he was Professor of Education at the University of Manchester and previously held academic and research posts at the universities of Nottingham and Warwick.

Chris's research interests focus on the interaction between educational and public policy and practice, specifically in relation to the improvement of outcomes in disadvantaged settings. The recurring themes are leadership, improvement and effectiveness, collaboration, equity, and organisational/system reform. Chris has undertaken research and evaluation projects for research councils, charities, national and local governments and their agencies. Chris has also led D&R projects with national and local government, schools and teachers to build the capacity for leading and managing change and improving student outcomes. Chris has published 11 books and over 130 peer-reviewed articles and chapters and he also serves on a number of editorial boards. Chris has held a number of Visiting Professorships. Chris is also President of the International Congress for School Effectiveness and Improvement.
