WHAT IS “CBA”?

The significance of developing our students as community-based artists (CBA) is twofold. First, the programme aims to nurture graduates who are artistically and culturally cognizant, i.e. possessing the ability to appreciate the artistic expressions of different cultures. These graduates are expected to commit themselves to developing and promoting the Arts across different contexts and settings. In addition to this commitment, our graduates are expected to apply the knowledge, skills and understandings gained from the programme to help make the Arts more accessible and welcomed in their own communities. With their own strengths and expertise, each graduate will contribute as a CBA in their own unique way.

PROGRAMME AIMS

This programme is the first undergraduate programme in Hong Kong to offer arts management and cultural studies components to complement discipline-based training in the creative arts. It aims to develop community-based artists, who are able to work across a range of established art forms and contribute to the promotion and development of the arts and arts education in the local, regional and international cultural and creative industries.

REGIONAL SUMMER INSTITUTE 2023

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Year 1 Admissions

For students with HKDSE qualifications:

Four core subjects and two elective subjects with

- Level 3 or above in English Language and Chinese Language;
- Level 2 or above in Mathematics (Compulsory Part) and two elective subjects; and
- “Attained” level in Citizenship and Social Development

Programme Entrance Requirements:

Satisfactory performance in a practical test* (for visual arts major) / an audition (for music major) and an interview in addition to the General Entrance Requirements

*Applicants who obtain Level 4 or above in HKDSE in Visual Arts will be exempted from the practical test.

The programme will also consider applicants with recognised qualifications other than HKDSE. Please visit www.apply.eduhk.hk/ug/nonjupas for details.

Senior Year Admissions

The programme reserves a number of Senior Year (i.e. Year 3) places for quality students holding Associate Degree / Higher Diploma (or equivalent) qualifications. Admitted students are only required to take 60 credit points and can complete the programme in two years. Applicants shall be considered on the basis of their academic achievements, interview performance and subject test result.

CAREER PROSPECTS

Students are prepared for a wide range of careers in the cultural and creative industries, the commercial and education sectors, the government and non-governmental organisations. Graduates may choose to pursue a teaching career by completing an additional year of professional teacher training or undertake further studies locally or overseas.

Programme Enquiries

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Any aspect of the course and course offerings (including, without limitation, the content of the course and the manner in which the course is taught) may be subject to change at any time at the sole discretion of the University. Without limiting the right of the University to amend the course and its course offerings, it is envisaged that changes may be required due to factors such as staffing, enrolment levels, logistical arrangements, curriculum changes, and other factors caused by unforeseeable circumstances. Tuition fees, once paid, are non-refundable.

Students admitted into this programme starting from the 2023/24 cohort are required to visit the Greater Bay Area (GBA) and/or other parts of Mainland China. Programme may also require students to participate in other non-local learning experience for completion of the programme. While the visits are heavily subsidised, students are still required to contribute part of the estimated cost of the visits (‘student contribution’), whereas personal entertainment, meals expenses, travel document fee and personal insurance costs will not be supported. The estimated cost of the visits for students admitted to the 2024/25 cohort is not available yet as it is subject to a variety of factors such as changes to the cost of the visits as a result of inflation, trip duration, traveling expenses, the exchange rate, etc. The exact amount of student contribution is thus not available.
