

Post-doctoral Fellow/Senior Research Assistant (Ref: PDF/SRA/IE/1120) Department of International Education

The Department of International Education is looking for a qualified and dedicated researcher to support the project "Representation of ethnic and religious minorities in textbooks: Multicultural education in Mainland China, Macau, Taiwan, and Hong Kong". This project is to analyse how ethnic and religious minorities in Mainland China, Macau, and Taiwan are represented in primary and secondary textbooks for social studies subjects and compare the extent, substance, and evolution of multicultural elements (focused on ethnic and religious minorities) in China, Macau, Taiwan, and Hong Kong government-school curriculum since the 1980s.

The appointee will be required to identify, order, and purchase textbooks; code and analyse text; administer and analyse data from teacher reliability surveys in China, Macau, and Taiwan; help prepare reports and academic articles; and supervise research assistants. They will also assist with developing theoretical analyses, including historical and sociological literature reviews and comparative analyses. The appointment will be for an initial period of at least 12 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Doctoral degree, preferably in Social Sciences, Education, or a related discipline, with a mastery of discourse analysis. They should provide evidence of scholarship and research experience in related disciplines. They should also have an excellent command of Chinese and English, good interpersonal and organisational skills, and the ability to work independently and as part of a team. Familiarity with education in China, Macau, and/or Taiwan, and interest and experience in philosophy of education and virtues education will be advantages. Applicants who possess a relevant Master's degree with substantial research experience may also apply, and will be considered at the rank of Senior Research Assistant. For the post of Senior Research Assistant, applicants should have a Master's Degree, plus at least one year's post master's degree full-time working experience or a doctorate.
