

Post-doctoral Fellow/Senior Research Assistant (Ref: PDF/SRA/CCFS/0121) Centre for Child and Family Science

The Centre for Child and Family Science is looking for a qualified and highly dedicated researcher to provide research support to the project entitled "Intervention and School-based Support for Dyslexia Students with English Learning Difficulty". This project is to develop and implement a tiered intervention model: supporting the learning of English as a second language for junior primary school students with dyslexia. This is part of the 3-year project funded by the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust.

The appointee will be required to develop assessment measures, collect data, analyse data and disseminate results, write reports and academic articles, train assessors, and supervise research assistants. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months commencing in January 2021, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Doctoral degree, preferably in Social Sciences, Education or a related discipline, with a mastery of statistical applications and analysis. They should provide evidence of scholarship, examples of research outputs and research experience in related disciplines. They should also have an excellent command of written Chinese and English, good interpersonal and organizational skills, and the ability to work independently and as part of a team responsibly. Applicants who possess a Master's Degree in related areas and substantial research experience may also apply, and will be considered at the rank of Senior Research Assistant. For the post of Senior Research Assistant, applicants should have a Master's Degree, plus at least one year's post master's degree full-time working experience or a doctorate.
