The appointee will provide support to the project entitled “Study on Transition of Chinese Language Learning and Teaching of Non-Chinese Speaking Children from Kindergarten Education to Primary Education” commissioned by sponsored by Standing Committee on Language Education and Research (SCOLAR). He/she will assist in data collection, data entry and project related administrative work. The appointment is expected to commence as soon as possible.

Applicants should have at least Level 2 or equivalent or above in five subjects including Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics in HKDSE; or Grade E (Level 2) or above in five subjects including Chinese, English (Syllabus B) and Mathematics in HKCEE or equivalent. He/she is preferably with a Bachelor’s Degree in Chinese, Education or related disciplines. He/she should be proficient in both English and Chinese (Cantonese and Putonghua), know well about Hong Kong education system. He/she should have a strong sense of responsibility, good communication and interpersonal skills with children, teachers and parents. Experience in educational research with children would be an advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
