

Research Assistant I (Ref: RAI/SEC/0721) Department of Special Education and Counselling

The appointee will be responsible for running projects related to emotion, emotion regulation, family relationship, and social interaction. Duties include, but not limited to, literature review, data collection, data analysis, drafting research reports, etc. The appointee is also expected to perform administrative support to the Principal Investigator. There will be chances for manuscript writing and publications, and attending international conferences if the appointee is interested. The appointee will also have the chance to help with outreaching to the community to promote mental health. The appointment will be for a 6-month period with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology or related discipline. He/she should have good command of both English and Chinese, and competency in data analysis and academic writing. He/she should be responsible, organized and attentive to details. Applicants should have experience with/be confident to learn eye-tracking research, preferably with experience using software (e.g. SPSS, E-prime, MPlus, R, EEGLAB, MatLLAB, etc.) to perform data analysis.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
