

## Research Assistant I (Ref: RAI/C&I/0921b) Department of Curriculum and Instruction

The appointee will be responsible for supporting research projects. He/she will assist in coordinating the meeting with school teachers, designing STEM teaching plan, analyzing the data for the report to schools, searching literature, supervising part-time student helpers, and performing other duties as assigned by the project leader. The appointment will be initially made for a period of 12 months, which can be further extended upon mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Educational or Psychology, preferably with relevant post-qualification full-time working experience, or a Master Degree. Candidates with past experience of using quantitative research software (e.g., SPSS, AMOS) is essential. Knowledge of coding and cross-disciplinary STEM education will be advantages. Applicants should be proficient in both written and spoken English and Chinese, self-motivated, and willing to learn to handle unfamiliar tasks. The knowledge and skills related to science education will be advantages.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
