

Senior Research Assistant (Ref: SRA/ELE/0921a) Department of English Language Education

The appointee will assist in a research project funded by SCOLAR. He/she will work closely with frontline English teachers and provide support to them regarding assessment in second language writing. The main duties will include conducting systematic literature review, assisting with developing research instruments, collecting and analyzing data, preparing research reports and dissemination material, as well as maintaining effective communication with multiple stakeholders of the participating schools. The appointee is expected to assume duty as soon as possible, and the initial appointment will be for a period of one year with the possibility of renewal subject to satisfactory performance and mutual agreement.

Applicants should have at least a Master's Degree (preferably a Doctoral degree) in Applied Linguistics, English Language Teaching or other related disciplines plus one year post Master's Degree full-time working experience. They should possess an excellent command of spoken and written English, a commitment to research, and the ability to write up research work for publications. They should have a good sense of responsibility and be able to work independently and as a member of a team. Knowledge of language assessment is an advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
