The appointee will be responsible for working within several research projects. His/her duties include, but are not limited to, providing research support to the Principal Investigator and research team, conducting literature review, scheduling participants, collecting data by using EEG scanning, eye-tracker and/or other tools, data analysis, writing report draft, project coordination, and to perform any other related duties as assigned. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology, Data Science or any related discipline is preferred. Experience or qualifications in working with SEN children is an advantage. Preference will be given to applicants who have at least 1 year' working experience. He/she should have the abilities and willingness to support colleagues in the Centre in developing and running research studies, and in producing research outputs. He/she should have a strong proficiency in both written and spoken both English and Chinese (including Cantonese). Great communication, computer and assessment tools' capability, independence, multi-tasking and attention to detail are essential.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
