

## Research Assistant I/II (Ref: 2100634) Department of Early Childhood Education

The appointee will provide research and administrative support to projects on (1) perspective-taking development in preschoolers, and (2) parent-child interaction during infancy and toddlerhood. The appointee is responsible for reviewing the literature, developing research materials, recruiting and testing young children, conducting interviews with parents, data coding and analysis, and drafting reports to parents/organisations. He/she will also coordinate activities facilitating disseminating of findings and research impact beyond academia, and perform other duties as assigned. The appointment will be for a period of 6 months with a possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

For the post of Research Assistant I, applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree, preferably in Psychology, Early Childhood Education and Care, or other related disciplines. Applicants with relevant post-qualification full-time working experience with infants and toddlers will be an advantage. For the post of Research Assistant II, applicants should have at least Level 2 or equivalent or above in five subjects including Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics in HKDSE; or Grade E (Level 2) or above in five subjects including Chinese, English (Syllabus B) and Mathematics in HKCEE or equivalent. He/she should be highly motivated, responsible, and able to work independently. He/she should also have excellent analytical, decision-making, and interpersonal communication skills, high proficiency in both written and spoken Chinese (Cantonese) and English, and strong PC skills including MS Office, Photoshop, SPSS.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
