The appointee will assist in multiple longitudinal studies, all of which examine how family relationships may affect child adjustment in the face of different stressors. The appointee will be involved in a wide range of research procedures, including study design, protocol development, school recruitment, data collection, data management, and data analysis. Also, the appointee will write both summary reports and academic papers. The appointee should be able to work independently as well as collaboratively, as some of the studies may involve other research assistants and teammates. The appointment will be for a period of 9 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have at least a Master's Degree in psychology, education, or related disciplines, plus at least one year of post Master's full-time working experience, preferably in conducting quantitative research, or a Doctoral Degree. Moreover, applicants should be able to conduct such analysis as regression, ANOVAs, path analysis, and SEM. Also, applicants should be research-oriented, self-motivated, and able to work under pressure. Experience of managing longitudinal research and publishing in academic journals is a huge advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
