The appointee will be responsible for providing research and academic support to the research team of the Department of Chinese Language Studies. The main duties include conducting background study and literature review, editing, designing research instruments, collecting and analyzing data and related information. He/she will also assist in duties such as reports and journal/monograph writing, and grant applications. The appointment will be for a period of around 10 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicant should have a Doctoral Degree, preferably in Teaching Chinese as a Second Language Education, Bilingual Education, or International Education Studies. He/she should also have strong analytical skills, excellent command of written and spoken English, high proficiency of Chinese in reading and writing, and good interpersonal skills. Research interest or experience in using qualitative data analysis software will be advantageous.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
