The Department of International Education seeks to recruit an emerging scholar at the rank of Assistant Professor in the field of global studies and international education, with a particular focus on teaching and learning in international schools. Candidates with substantial knowledge of and teaching experience in the following domains are particularly encouraged to apply:

- the International Baccalaureate, Cambridge Assessment International Education, and/or the International Primary Curriculum; and
- international education, global studies in education, and education studies.

Applicants should have a Doctoral degree in one or more of the relevant areas. They should be an active researcher with a growing publication record and be able to continue conducting research that attracts competitive external funding and leads to publication in leading international journals. The successful candidate should have post-qualification teaching experience and a record of excellence in teaching. They should also have expertise in digital teaching and learning/digital literacy. Professional fluency in written and spoken English is required. The ability to teach in Cantonese and/or Putonghua, knowledge of Chinese education, and the ability to teach in other areas of the department, such as in general education and life and values education, will be an advantage. The successful candidate should be in the post by August 2022.
