We are examining how social media affects young people's well-being and are seeking a bright Research Assistant I to help us collect and analyse data from social media / social networking sites (SNS) to understand the youths' challenges and needs in the digital age. The appointee will provide support to the research team in multiple tasks, such as collecting data from participants, analysing their use and perceptions of social media / SNS etc. He/she will also perform any other academic duties as assigned by the project investigator(s) or his/her delegate(s). The initial appointment will be for a period of 12 months with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have at least a Bachelor's Degree (preferably a Master's degree) in Psychology, Applied Linguistics or other education-related disciplines, with knowledge of quantitative and qualitative methodology. They should have expertise in one or more of the following: statistics, computational linguistics, linguistics, multimodal and thematic analysis. Relevant research experience would be an advantage. They should also have good communication and organizational skills, high level of proficiency in spoken and written English and Chinese, good ability to work both independently and collaboratively.
