**Project Title: Homogeneities among Children with Neurodevelopmental Disorders: A Transdiagnostic Approach**

**[Appointment Period: 12 months]**

The Department of Special Education and Counselling is seeking a qualified and highly dedicated person to provide research support to a project aiming at studying homogeneities among children with neurodevelopmental disorders. He/she will be responsible for preparing and managing the project and relevant research studies, writing reports/journal articles/research proposals, and any other research-related tasks assigned by the supervisor. The project will last for three years, and the initial appointment will be for a period of 12 months with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Doctoral degree, preferably in developmental/educational psychology, or related disciplines with evidence of scholarship, examples of research outputs and extensive research experience. Priority will be given to candidates with sophisticated knowledge and research training/experience on neurodevelopmental disorder/specific learning disabilities (SpLD), such as dyslexia, dyscalculia, ADHD, ASD, etc., and relevant measures and techniques (such as machine learning in data analysis, and/or EEG/ERP). They should be proficient in both English and Chinese. They should be self-motivated, willing to work in a team, and able to work under tight timeline.
