The appointee will work on the project KeySteps@JC Phase Two, which aims to enhance children's well-being by establishing community-based children's centres and running kindergarten-based interventions for underprivileged families. Part of a multi-party, multidisciplinary project, the work conducted by the EdUHK will focus on children's access to quality educational experiences.

Applicants should possess a doctoral degree in Education, Early Childhood, Social Science, Psychology, or a related discipline. They should have excellent English communication skills (both verbal and written), experience in running applied or translational projects, and be able to work independently as well as in a multidisciplinary team. Cantonese speaking skills and one to two years of work experience will be highly desirable. The appointee will help develop professional development programmes for kindergarten teachers, engage in school recruitment and retention, and assist in school assessment. They will also assist in data analysis, report writing, and dissemination.
