The appointee will be involved in a wide range of research procedures, including study design, protocol development, school recruitment, data collection, data management, and data analysis. Also, the appointee will be involved in the writing of summary reports and academic papers. The appointee should be able to work independently as well as collaboratively, as some of the studies may involve other research assistants and teammates. The appointment will be from as soon as possible to 31 December 2023, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor Degree in psychology, education, or related disciplines. Moreover, applicants should be able to conduct such analysis as regression and ANOVAs. Experience of managing research projects is an advantage.
