Project Title: Early Advancement in Resilience (EAR): A Downward Extension of the 3Es Programme that promotes the Social-emotional Competence of Low-SES Children

[Appointment Period: 12-24 months]

The appointee will assist in a project sponsored by the Simon K. Y. Lee Foundation. The project seeks to promote the socioemotional competence of children aged between 2-4 (N and K1 students), and encompasses support for teachers and parents of children with social-emotional needs.

The appointee will work collaboratively with teammates to evaluate the effectiveness of the project. He/she will be involved in collecting, cleaning, and managing data. Moreover, he/she will be involved in other research procedures, such as study design, protocol development, school recruitment, data analysis, and report writing. Finally, the appointee will liaise with teachers and parents and supervise student helpers. The appointment period can be up to 2 years, depending on the appointee's qualifications and experience.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology or related disciplines and some experience of conducting research. Applicants should be self-motivated, able to work under pressure, and willing to learn. Good command of Chinese and English and basic knowledge about statistical analysis are advantages.
