Project Title: Probing the development of risk-taking in infants: A new paradigm with

implications for drowning prevention [Appointment Period: 17 months]

The appointee will provide research support on sport coaching, sports psychology, and sports and physical activity. Duties include developing and implementing research projects; preparing literature reviews; collecting data; conducting interviews in English and Chinese, transcribing recordings; writing papers; and other project-related administrative work. The appointee will participate in team meetings, project seminars, and publications as desired. The appointment will be for around 17 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

The applicants should have a Doctoral Degree in Physical Education, Sport Science, Psychology, or other related disciplines. Experience in relevant research and journal paper writing in the above disciplines are required. They should have experience with qualitative and/or quantitative methodologies. Applicants should have an excellent command of both written English and Chinese; proficiency in spoken Cantonese. They should also be self-motivated, well-organized, have good interpersonal and communication skills, and be able to work independently and collectively as good team members.
