The appointee will be required to provide individual psychological counselling for students; provide psychological testing services on mood and personality; conduct workshops and organize programmes of various nature on mental health and psychological wellness; arrange support services and trainings for student groups to enhance their adjustment and development; and provide counselling support for student in crisis.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's or Master's degree in counselling / social work / clinical or educational psychology, with 5 or more years of post-qualification work experience, preferably in tertiary institutions or other mental health agencies working with young people, and under membership of relevant professional bodies in Hong Kong or overseas. They should also be proficient in both written and spoken English and Chinese (Cantonese and Putonghua).

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
