The Department seeks an instructor with expertise related to the Department's undergraduate teaching areas in English-language literature and related areas, like cultural studies. Assignments will include for example "Approaching English Literature" and/or "Readings in New Literatures in English." The appointee will also be expected to contribute to Departmental projects and initiatives, and may be expected to supervise students during their teaching practicums. The appointee will be expected to commence employment around August 2023.

Applicants must have a Doctoral or Master's Degree in a discipline related to literature or culture, preferably with some relevant post-qualification teaching experience. They should preferably possess a relevant professional teaching certificate, e.g. a Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) or qualification of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong or other qualification of equivalence. Evidence of quality teaching is required.
