The appointment will be for a period of 5 months.

The Applicants should have a recognized bachelor's degree or above in psychology or related disciplines, good interpersonal and communication skills, and strong work ethics. They should be highly proficient in both English and Chinese and literate in computer applications including MS Office and SPSS. Experience with computer programming and statistical analysis software packages such as R, Matlab and EEG software is preferred but not required. Relevant experience in sleep research will be an advantage.
