

Educational Development Officer / Educational Development Assistant

The appointee will be responsible for supporting curriculum development to a coding education project. Duties include developing teaching and learning materials for computational thinking (CT) development and coding courses to primary school teachers, leading the curriculum team in developing and refining curriculum which helps them to implement CT education in primary schools, consolidating and reviewing the materials, and liaising with internal and external parties. The appointee will be expected to carry out other duties as assigned by the Project Supervisor. The appointment will be for a period of around 1 year.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree, preferably in Psychology, Social Sciences, Educational Technology, Education or related disciplines, with at least two years' post-qualification full-time working experience. Experience in developing or teaching programming language, such as Scratch, App Inventor will be an advantage. Applicants should be proficient in both English and Chinese (fluent in spoken Cantonese is a must); attentive to details; and with good interpersonal and communication skills. They should be self-motivated and able to work as a team member. Immediate availability is preferred. Fresh graduate and candidate with less experience will be considered for the post of Educational Development Assistant.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
