Project Title: Role of Distraction on Children's Math Performance

The Department of Early Childhood Education is inviting applications for the position of Research Assistant I for the project “Role of Distraction on Children’s Math Performance”. The study will focus on examining the effects of distraction on children’s math performance and learning to further our understanding of the determiners of successful math performance in children and of the sources of individual differences in math performance and math development.

The appointee will support a variety of research and administrative tasks. These tasks may include recruiting schools, administering standardized psychological and achievement tests, assisting in literature searches, coordinating and scheduling testing sessions, managing data, maintaining project-related documents and files, arranging meetings and events, and any other duties as assigned by the Principal Investigator.

Applicants should possess a Bachelor's degree in Psychology, Education, or related subjects. He/She should be familiar with at least one research software (e.g., SPSS, E-Prime), demonstrate high proficiency in spoken English and Cantonese, have excellent communication and interpersonal skills, and be able to work independently and collaboratively in a team environment. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement. Experience working with children and in conducting research are desirable.
