The appointee will support the project named "Life and Career Development Across the Life Span: A Pathway to Enhance Urban Resilience in Hong Kong for Post-Covid Era." This multidisciplinary and collaborative project aims to develop capacity to pursue a larger research on life and career development in Hong Kong in the post-COVID era. The appointee is required to provide administrative and operational support to carry out the project. He/she will be responsible for conducting literature review, developing research materials, assisting in the coordination and administrative work of the project, supporting data collection and data analysis, writing papers for conference and manuscripts, writing reports, and performing any other duties as assigned by the project team. The appointment will be 12 months with the possibility of renewal subject to review.

Applicants should have a relevant Bachelor's Degree in psychology, sociology, public health, data science, quantitative social science, or a related discipline with strong interpersonal and communication skills, good command of both written and spoken English and Chinese (including Cantonese), self-motivation, and the ability to work independently, preferably with some experience in supporting research and training programmes.
