

## Lecturer I/II (Ref: 2301231) Department of Special Education and Counselling

The Department is now seeking qualified and highly dedicated persons for the teaching positions at the rank of Lecturer I / Lecturer II in the field of speech-language pathology. The appointees will be responsible for teaching duties for undergraduate programmes and/or above, contributing to programme development, engaging in departmental and faculty services. They are required to supervise students in speech therapy practicum and teaching practice. The appointment will be for a period of three years.

The appointee(s) will participate in activities related to teaching, coordinating and supervising students on practicum and projects; conducting curriculum and programme development; and performing programme and course management. Field experience supervision may also be required.

For the post of Lecturer I, applications should have a Master's degree, preferably a Doctoral Degree, in Speech and Language Pathology or a related discipline plus a minimum of 4 years' relevant post-qualification teaching or professional experience in the areas indicated above. Applicants who have less relevant post-qualification teaching or professional experience will be considered for the post of Lecturer II. Applicants should have experience in speech therapist training.

It would be advantageous to applicants to have the ability to teach through more than one medium of instruction (English/Cantonese/Putonghua).
