The appointee will provide support to the project entitled “Intervention and School-based Support for Dyslexic Students with English Learning Difficulty”. This project is to develop and implement a tiered intervention model: supporting the learning of English as a second language for primary school students with reading and writing difficulties.

The appointee will be responsible for developing and implementing training materials for primary school students and teachers; assisting in school-based curriculum design and development; providing onsite support to schools; running training workshops for teachers; liaising with school personnel; organizing knowledge sharing activities; and assisting in data collection. The appointment will be from as soon as possible to 30 June 2024, with possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a bachelor’s degree and a Postgraduate Diploma in Education, preferably in English Language, and with several years of post-qualification work experience in primary school or related educational settings. He/she should also have high proficiency in both written and spoken English and Chinese; excellent interpersonal, organizational and IT skills. They should be a good team player, attentive to details, self-motivate and be able to work under pressure. Those with experience of working with students with reading and writing difficulties are highly preferred.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
