The appointee will assist Principal Investigator and Co-Investigators to initiate various large scale projects, including 1) study on the career and life development of adolescents and working adults in Hong Kong in the context of globalization, regionalization, and economic restructuring; 2) research in Chinese Medicine related fields; 3) evaluative research on various projects of social innovation, etc. Reporting to the Principal Investigator and Co-Investigators, the appointee is expected to communicate and collaborate effectively with other stakeholders and project teams to facilitate project implementation. The appointee will be responsible for (a) collecting and analyzing data, and compiling an internal database, and project reports; (b) organizing workshops, annual events, and others; (c) support the management and development of large scale research projects; and (d) performing other administrative duties as assigned. The appointment will be for a period of 3 years.

Applicant should have a Bachelor's degree in a sociology with several years of post-qualification work experience. A higher degree in sociology could be an advantage. Competence in both qualitative and quantitative research methods is an advantage, and strong command in both spoken and written English and Chinese (Cantonese) and with good communication skills are essential. Experiences in relevant research and project management, as well as liaison with research funding bodies are essential. They should also be well-organized, have good interpersonal skills, and able to work independently and collectively in a team. The appointee will also be occasionally required to perform duties in non-regular hours.
