The appointee will help with the management and implementation of a Gifted Education Fund project for primary school students in Hong Kong, which aims to engage gifted students in active, quality and challenging interdisciplinary inquiry to tackle climate change issue as a STEAM professional. He/she will assist the Project Leaders and team members who participate in the project to (1) provide administrative support of the project; (2) review relevant teaching and learning materials; (3) explore and design new teaching and learning activities with associated materials; and (4) support the training for participants and the implementation of the project. The initial appointment will be for a period of around 10 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree, preferably a Master's Degree in Education, Science, Geography, Environmental Science or related disciplines, with several years of post-qualification working experience and good command in both written and spoken English and Chinese. Knowledge, skills, and experiences in field studies, as well as learning and teaching resources packages development, are essential. He/she should also be a good team player, attentive to details, highly self-motivated, and able to work under pressure. Immediate availability is preferred.
