Applicants should have a Bachelor degree in Translation, Communication, Journalism, Marketing or a related discipline, preferably with several years of full-time experience in corporate or marketing communication; proficiency in English and Chinese (including Putonghua); strong communication, writing and editing skills; solid experience in online marketing campaigns and social media management, particularly on platforms such as WeChat and Xiaohongshu. Knowledge of Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator will be advantageous.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
