The Department is now accepting applications for the post of Senior Lecturer II or Lecturer I/II in the fields of digital music practice, electroacoustic music, sound design and/or multi-media composition. In addition to course teaching, the appointee will participate in project supervision, field experience supervision, internship supervision, guidance to students in the capacity of personal tutors, and so on. The appointee is expected to contribute to curriculum and programme development, programme and course management, and partake in departmental activities and represent the Department in meetings and various boards and committees, and provide good service contributions to the University and the community.

Applicants should have at least a Master's degree in digital music, electroacoustic music, sound design, multimedia composition, or a related discipline.

- For Senior Lecturer II, applicants should have a minimum of 8 years' post-qualification teaching experience; or preferably a Doctoral degree plus a minimum of 3 years' relevant post-qualification teaching experience.
- For Lecturer I, applicants should have a minimum of 4 years' relevant post-qualification teaching experience.
- Applicants with less teaching experience may be considered for the post of Lecturer II.

Applicants should preferably possess a relevant professional teaching certificate, e.g. PGDE or qualification of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong or other qualification of equivalence. Proven evidence of quality teaching and/or a successful record of relevant professional experience is required.
