Applications are invited for appointment as a Post-doctoral Fellow in the Department of English Language Education. He/she is expected to assist in school ethnographic fieldwork, data analysis, and writing research reports and publications. He/she is also expected to perform administrative support to the supervisor and his/her research team. They should be self-motivated, willing to work in a team, and able to work under tight timelines. Expertise in GenAI and technology-assisted language learning, teacher education, classroom discourse analysis, and design-based education research would be an advantage.

Applicants should have a Doctoral degree in Applied Linguistics or a related discipline. Expertise in content and language integrated learning (CLIL), second language education, concept-and-language mapping (CLM), translanguaging and trans-semiotizing (TL-TS) will be an advantage. They should have a good command of written and spoken English, Cantonese and Chinese, and familiarity with qualitative and quantitative research methods.
