He/She will be expected to carry out other duties as assigned by the Principal Investigator. The appointment will be for a period of 5 months with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should possess a recognized Bachelor's Degree, and preferably a Master's Degree in Educational Technology or related area, with relevant research experience. Familiarity with emerging technologies like generative AI tools and with neuroscience is an advantage. They should have good interpersonal and communication skills, the ability to work independently; good IT literacy, good problem-solving skills; excellent written and verbal communication skills with high proficiency in written English and Chinese, and spoken English.
