

## Lecturer II (Ref: 2400353) Department of Literature and Cultural Studies

The Department now seeks applications for the post of Lecturer II in the area of Classical and/or Modern Chinese literature and culture. In addition to course teaching, the appointee will participate in activities related to project supervision, field experience supervision, internship supervision, guidance to students in the capacity of personal tutors, and so on. The appointee is expected to contribute to curriculum and programme development, programme and course management and partake in departmental activities and represent the Department in meetings and various boards and committees, and provide good service contributions to the University and the community. The appointee will be expected to commence employment around August 2024.

Applicants should have at least a Master's degree, preferably a doctoral degree in a discipline related to literature or culture with some relevant post-qualification teaching experience. They should preferably possess a relevant professional teaching certificate, e.g. a Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) or qualification of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong or other qualification of equivalence. Evidence of quality teaching is required.
