Project Title: HKJC Project - Financial Education for Upper Primary Students [Appointment Period: 24 months]

The appointee will collaborate with the research team to conduct thorough evaluations of financial education programs to assess their impact, effectiveness, and value for a sizeable project on financial education in local primary schools, including the following major tasks but not limited to any other research-related duties as assigned:

- Collaborate with the research team to refine evaluation frameworks and methodologies such
 as designing and validating measurement tools, formulating online questionnaire surveys,
 using the Item Responses Theory (IRT) method in evaluation
- Conduct data collection and analyze data to determine program outcomes
- Report findings and provide actionable recommendations based on evaluation findings
- Draft articles for social media and journal publication
- Ensure compliance with evaluation standards and guidelines

The initial appointment will be for two years with the possibility of renewal, subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should hold a Ph.D. or equivalent doctoral degree in a relevant field such as finance, economics, educational psychology, or a related discipline. His/her doctoral research should relate to financial literacy, curriculum design, teacher development, assessment tools, program evaluation or equivalent, with proven experience in using the IRT method. Applicants should submit the curriculum vitae (CV), research statement, and references. The application materials should highlight the applicant's research experience, publications, and his/her alignment with the research interests of the position.

The successful appointee should conduct independent research and publish papers in academic journals. The appointee should have high proficiency in written and spoken English and Chinese, good interpersonal, communication, IT, time management, and problem-solving skills.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
