The appointee will assist in the *Child Advancement Technologies & Global Pedagogies Team* (ChATGPT) project. The appointee will be responsible for providing support to the project team led by the Principal Investigator, Professor Li Hui. He/she will contribute to a dynamic team by: (a) planning and managing logistics for a series of conferences aimed at connecting scholars worldwide; (b) building and maintaining relationships with domestic and international collaborators, requiring regular correspondence and coordination; (c) crafting and refining communications material, including the creation of insightful newsletters that highlight project progress and insights; (d) fulfilling various administrative and supportive tasks as the project evolves, showcasing a flexible and problem-solving attitude. The appointment will be for a period of 6 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement. The start date is negotiable, ideally 1 June 2024, or as soon as thereafter.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably with a Master's degree, in Neuroscience, Psychology, ICT, or above in any disciplines related to child development, psychology, education, and psycholinguistics, with considerable quantitative research experience. They are expected to possess good work ethics, good communication and interpersonal skills, the ability to work independently with initiative and under pressure, a strong sense of responsibility, and proficiency in spoken and written English and Chinese.
