

Senior Lecturer II / Lecturer I / Lecturer II [2 posts] (Ref: 2500262)

The appointees for Senior Lecturer II / Lecturer I / Lecturer II will be responsible for teaching psychology, education-related, and general education courses, supervising student research projects and field experiences, and contributing to curriculum and programme development. Additionally, they are expected to demonstrate scholarship of teaching by conducting relevant research studies.

For the post of Senior Lecturer II, applicants should have a Master's degree in Psychology or a related discipline plus a minimum of 8 years' relevant post-qualification teaching / professional experience; or preferably a Doctoral degree plus a minimum of 3 years' relevant post-qualification teaching / professional experience. For the post of Lecturer I, applicants should have a Master's degree in Psychology or a related discipline plus a minimum of 4 years' relevant post-qualification teaching / professional experience. Applicants with less teaching experience may be considered for the post of Lecturer II.

Applicants should preferably possess a relevant professional teaching certificate, e.g., PGDE or qualification of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong or other qualification of equivalence. Priority will be given to those with experience in teaching professional courses at the tertiary level.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include the University's Voluntary Contributions to MPF Scheme or a contract-end lump sum payment (totaling up to 10% of the basic salary for the position of Lecturer I and Lecturer II, and totaling up to 15% of the basic salary for the position of Senior Lecturer II), leave, medical and dental benefits, and, where applicable, housing benefits.
