Project Title: Impact Case Study Projects

[Appointment Period: 9 months]

The appointee will work on a research project related to the learning experience of Hong Kong's underprivileged students learning experience in technology-enhanced supplementary tutoring. He/she will be required to conduct literature review, invite and liaise with participants, conduct interviews, transcribe and analyse data and perform other duties assigned by the project investigators. The appointment will be for a period of around 9 months, expected to commence on 15 May 2025 up to 14 February 2026 (9 months).

Applicants should preferably have a Bachelor's Degree in Education or a related field. They should possess the competence to conduct data collection and analysis independently. They should have high proficiency in spoken Cantonese and English, excellent communication skills, and good written English. Preference will be given to those familiar with qualitative research methods and NVivo. Knowledge in education-related areas and experience in research paper publication will be an advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
