Project Title: Social Media Analytics Research Teams (SMART) [Appointment Period: 15 months]

The appointee will be involved in a series of research projects in social media, cyberbullying and fake news. He/she will provide support to the project team members in planning, conducting, and coordinating the project activities. He/she will conduct literature review, data collection, data entry, data management and analysis, report and manuscript writing, protocol design for intervention study, and liaison with collaborators and organizations. The deliverables of the projects may include teaching and learning packages, intervention programs, training workshops, seminars, and publications. The appointment will be for a period of around 15 months with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

The Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably in Psychology or a related discipline; interest in conducting research projects related to social media; good communication, presentation, and interpersonal skills in both written and spoken English and Chinese (Cantonese is preferred); strong administrative and management skills; research knowledge and skills in using SPSS; enthusiasm, self-motivation, and the ability to work independently; and strong commitment to creating social change through high quality projects.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
