The appointee will be hired to assist the Project Leader in implementing the project and overseeing administrative matters. The project assistant will play a significant role in preparing the Mindfulness-Based Social-Emotional Learning (MBSEL) programme's curriculum and teaching materials. In addition, he/she will liaise with secondary schools for recruiting participants and scheduling programme implementation. Moreover, he/she will be responsible for the organization of professional development workshops and dissemination seminars as well as the production of project website. Furthermore, he/she will manage all financial matters and personnel issues related to the project. The initial appointment will be for a period of 12 months' with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

The Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree in Psychology, Education, or related discipline and possess post-qualification working experience in coordinating research and development projects; interest in conducting research projects related to education/mental health; good communication, presentation, and interpersonal skills in both written and spoken English and Chinese (Cantonese); strong administrative and management skills; research knowledge and skills in using SPSS; enthusiasm, self-motivation, and the ability to work independently and under pressure; and strong commitment to creating social change through high quality projects.
