He/She will receive training and supervision while assisting with: (a) planning and conducting data collection and analysis; (b) carrying out literature reviews; (c) contributing to manuscript writing; (d) preparing materials for reports and presentations; and (e) performing any other duties as assigned. The appointment will be for a period of 7 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably a Master's degree, in a related discipline. He/She should have considerable quantitative research experience. They are expected to possess good work ethic, good communication and interpersonal skills, the ability to work independently with initiative and under pressure, a strong sense of responsibility, and proficiency in spoken and written English and Chinese.
