The appointee will be responsible for providing a wide range of administrative support to the project team for a project in relation to enhancing undergraduate student employability. He/she will help coordinate the project implementation and promotion; assist in collecting data, conducting evaluations, preparing reports, and compiling materials; organise meetings, seminars, workshops, and other dissemination activities; supervise student helpers; and perform any other duties as assigned by the Principal Project Supervisors (PPSs) and Co-PPS. The successful applicant will be appointed for a period of 16 months.

Applicants should have a recognised Bachelor's degree with post-qualification work experience in tertiary education settings. They should have high proficiency in both English and Chinese (Cantonese and Putonghua), good analytical and problem-solving skills as well as interpersonal and communication skills. They should also be self-motivated, attentive to details, capable of working independently and multitasking.
