

Assistant Physical Education Officer (Ref: 2501186) Student Affairs Office

The appointee will be responsible for providing programme and administrative support to the Sports Development Section of the Student Affairs Office. Major duties include the routine operation of sports teams in collaboration with internal and external parties at various levels, overseeing or arranging USFHK competitions, promoting and organising physical wellness activities at the University, liaising and attending sports events and the associated meeting(s), and handling frontline services and student inquiries. Additionally, the appointee will need to assist with sports facility bookings and management, update and maintain the database/system, manage contracts, handle relevant documentation, and perform any other appropriate duties assigned by their supervisor.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree, preferably with work experience in the tertiary education sector. They should possess a strong passion for working with and helping students enhance their engagement. Additionally, proficiency in both English and Chinese (including Putonghua), computer literacy, and website management skills are required. Occasional work outside normal office hours may be necessary.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include the University's Voluntary Contributions to MPF Scheme or a contract-end lump sum payment (totaling up to 10% of the basic salary), leave, medical and dental benefits. The appointee will hold a substantive rank of Executive Assistant in the University.
