Project Title: Prosody Matters: Impacts of Speech and Reading Prosody on Reading Comprehension in Children Who Are Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing

We are seeking a motivated and detail-oriented candidate to support an exciting research project examining the role of prosody in reading comprehension among children who are deaf or hard-of-hearing (DHH). The appointees will work closely with the Principal Investigator and research team to conduct participant recruitment, data collection, transcription, analysis, and administrative tasks. This is an excellent opportunity for someone interested in linguistics, speech-language pathology, deaf education, or developmental psychology to gain hands-on research experience.

Applicants should hold a Bachelor's degree, preferably in Speech-Language Pathology, Linguistics, Psychology, Education, Communication Sciences and Disorders, Deaf Education, or a closely related field, with strong organizational skills, meticulous attention to detail, and the ability to juggle multiple tasks effectively. Excellent interpersonal and communication abilities are essential, particularly experience interacting with children and families from diverse backgrounds; the role demands both independent work and seamless team collaboration. Preferred qualifications include a Master's degree or relevant coursework, hands-on experience with deaf or hard-of-hearing (DHH) populations, or familiarity with cochlear implants and hearing aids; additional assets are knowledge of prosody and phonetics, expertise in acoustic analysis tools like Praat, prior research involvement in data collection, transcription, or coding, and proficiency with statistical software such as SPSS or R, or qualitative analysis methods.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
