Project Title: Physiological and Psychological Responses to Exercise: Pilot Study on Time Perception

[Appointment Period: 12 months]

The appointee will work closely with Professor Edwards, the Project Holder, and other project members to support a range of research activities. Duties may include, but are not limited to: liaising with NGOs, community centres, sports teams, schools, and other organisations; participant recruitment; physiological and psychological data collection; data entry and analysis; literature review; and assisting with the preparation of research reports and academic manuscripts. The appointee may also be required to perform any other duties as assigned by the Project Holder or project team. The position requires flexibility, as some duties may take place during weekends or weekday evenings. The appointment will be for a period of 12 months.

For the post of Research Assistant I, applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Exercise Physiology, Sport Psychology, Sport and Exercise Sciences, Physical Education, or a related health discipline. Preferably have a Master's degree or above. For the post of Research Assistant II, applicants should have at least Level 2 or equivalent or above in five subjects including Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics in HKDSE; or Grade E (Level 2) or above in five subjects including Chinese, English (Syllabus B) and Mathematics in HKCEE or equivalent.

Applicants should have strong self-motivation, good organisational skills, and the ability to work both independently and collaboratively. A good command of written and spoken English and Chinese (including Cantonese) will be an advantage. Preference will be given to candidates with prior research experience, particularly in data collection involving human participants.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
