The Department of Chinese Language Studies (CHL) invites applications for two Fractional Lecturer I positions to support its expanding teaching portfolio and programme development. This appointment offers an excellent opportunity for suitably qualified candidates to contribute to high-quality teaching and curriculum development within a dynamic and collaborative academic environment.

The appointee will be responsible for delivering teaching and learning activities across undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, including the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Digital Chinese Culture and Communication, Bachelor of Education (Honours) (Chinese Language) (BA(DCCC) & BEd(CL)), and the MA in Teaching Chinese as an International Language (MA(TCIL)).

Key responsibilities include: i) undertaking teaching duties at undergraduate and/or postgraduate levels, and supervising students where appropriate; ii) contributing to curriculum and programme development, as well as programme and course management; iii) supporting departmental teaching and learning initiatives, including innovative pedagogical practices; iv) assisting in the planning and implementation of academic activities, events, and initiatives in alignment with departmental and University priorities; v) contributing to teaching practicum (Field Experience) supervision in teacher education programmes; and vi) participating in departmental activities and providing service to the University and the wider community.

The Department is particularly interested in candidates with expertise in one or more of the following areas:

- i. Chinese Language Education/ Teaching Chinese as an International Language (TCSL), including Chinese language pedagogy, classroom instruction, and discourse analysis; and/or
- ii. Classical Chinese and Chinese linguistics, including Chinese etymology, classical texts, Chinese culture, and the application of digital approaches in Chinese studies.

Applicants should possess a Doctoral Degree in these areas, along with a minimum of four years' relevant post-qualification teaching experience. Evidence of high-quality teaching at the tertiary level is also required. Candidates with postgraduate teaching experience are particularly encouraged to apply.
