The Department offers a vibrant and collegial academic environment, with expertise spanning health literacy, telehealth, physical literacy, sports pedagogy, high-performance physiology, digital physical education, sports nutrition, mental health and well-being. We are now seeking colleagues who can complement and extend these strengths across research, teaching, and service. While we particularly welcome applicants with expertise in health education, sports and exercise psychology, sports injury, school health, infection control, sports nutrition for high performance, mental health, health counselling, physical activity and health promotion, public health, drug education and prevention, peer mediation, sports management and development, and broader health-related studies, we also encourage candidates with experience in STEAM-infused physical education and physical activity, and statistics and measurement in health and physical education, who are developing strong research profiles that can contribute meaningfully to the Department's strategic priorities.

The appointees will undertake teaching at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels, supervise students on teaching practice, community health practice, research projects, capstone projects and contribute to programme development. They will engage actively in research leading to competitive grant funding and publications in leading international journals, and participate in knowledge transfer, professional service, and community engagement. The successful candidates will also share our commitment to internationalisation, with a willingness to take a substantive role in promoting the Department and the University globally, including potential leadership in organising an international academic conference. The appointee may be required to travel outside of Hong Kong and undertake work including teaching duties as assigned by the University, where necessary.

**Applicants should have:**

- A doctoral degree in a relevant discipline.
- An emerging or established record of research and publication in internationally recognised journals, with clear potential for securing external research funding.
- Demonstrated excellence in teaching and student engagement in the tertiary sector, with the ability to teach across a range of subject areas relevant to the Department.
- A collegial approach to academic citizenship and the ability to contribute to departmental, faculty, and university service.
- Competence in English is essential, and ability in Chinese will be an advantage.
